

VOTER INFORMATION

Voting Requirements

You are eligible to register and vote if you are a United States citizen, at least 18 years of age by the day of the election, and a resident of Washington State.

Voting Registration

You may obtain a mail-in registration form at the Spokane County Elections Office, all State offices, all City clerks, the Department of Motor Vehicles, staffed fire stations, schools and libraries or get a printable registration form on-line at www.spokanecounty.org/elections. You must register by mail **at least 30 days** before an election. You may register in person at the Elections Office **up to 15 days** before an election. **Office Hours: M-F 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m.**

Change of Registration

Change of name or address, even within the same precinct, will make it necessary for you to change your voter registration. Contact the Spokane County Election office at 477-2320 for information about that procedure or simply submit a new voter registration form. Changes to voter registration must be completed **30 days before** an election or you may not be able to vote in that election.

Vote-by-Mail Ballots

Spokane County is now a vote-by-mail county for all elections. All ballots are mailed out to registered voters 18 days prior to the election. You no longer need to request an absentee ballot.

Once you receive your mail-in ballot, vote and mail it back. Be sure to sign the affidavit on the back of the envelope. Vote-by-mail ballots must be postmarked no later than Election Day. You may also deliver your ballot to a Voter Service Center on Election Day only from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Ballots may be delivered to the County Elections Office at 1033 W. Gardner Ave. any time before 8 pm Election Night, or to the Auditor's Office in the County Courthouse at 1116 W. Broadway Ave during normal business hours.

Voter Service Centers

Centers are available on Election Day – call Elections Office (477-2320) or go to www.spokanecounty.org/elections for locations. Services are available for those who have spoiled their ballot, need replacement envelopes, need to vote a provisional ballot, want to drop-off their ballot instead of mailing it or those needing special assistance. Each Voter Service Center has a Disability Accessibility Voting Unit (DAU) for those who need help in filling out their ballot, such as persons with limited eye sight or dexterity or those with cognitive disabilities.
